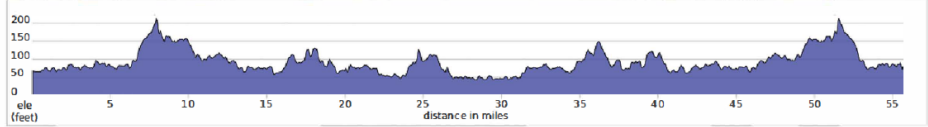
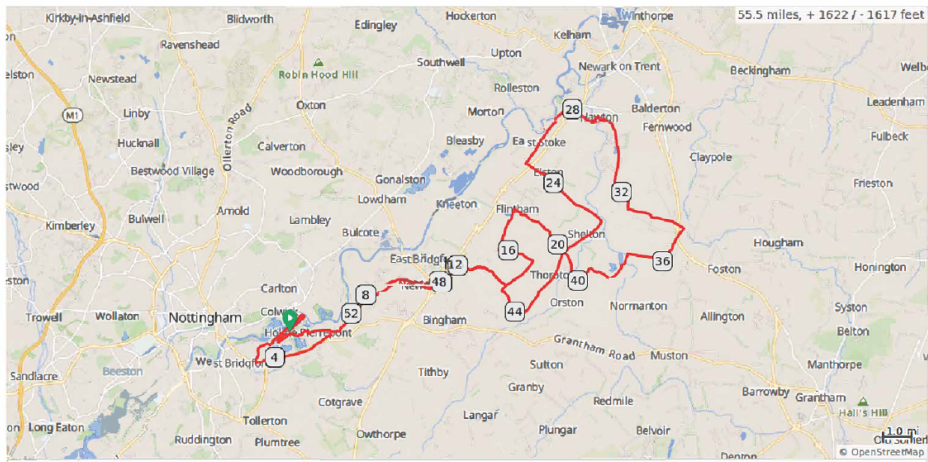


Outlaw Half Nottingham 2026 - 2. Bike Route

OUTLAW NOTTINGHAM HALF TRIATHLON, SUNDAY 17 MAY 2026

Dear Resident

On 17 May 2026 THE·TEAM Mass Participation will be organising a triathlon event in Nottinghamshire. The event will see over 1600 competitors taking up the challenge of a 1.2 mile Swim, followed by a 56 mile Cycle before finishing with a 13.1 mile Run.

This is the 13th year this event has taken place and is effectively the 'little brother' of our main Outlaw Triathlon event which is held annually in July (26 July 2026). We have been working with the Highways departments in both Nottinghamshire and Lincolnshire to maintain the bike course for 2026. We are also working with local Councils and businesses to maximise the potential benefit to the local economy with athletes and spectators travelling from across the UK to support the event, whilst also ensuring that the event has minimal impact on local residents and is embraced by local people.

The event will be based at the National Water Sports Centre (Holme Pierrepont) Nottingham, with the swim and run sections taking place in the lake and around the lake and white-water course respectively. The cycle section will travel through the beautiful Nottinghamshire Countryside using a route which will pass along the A52, through Radcliffe on Trent and then heading west through Car Colston before heading through Screveton, Flintham, Elston, Farndon, Hawton and Cotham before crossing into Lincolnshire and Long Bennington, then heading back to Holme Pierrepont via Alverton, Flawborough, Thoroton, Aslockton and Scarrington. The cyclists will then head back through Radcliffe on Trent, before cutting through Holme Pierrepont Hall – see the map at: [Outlaw Nottingham Half 2026 Bike Route](#)

We have been working closely with Nottinghamshire County Council Highways department for a number of years to ensure that we get a balance between providing a safe route for the athletes and making sure the impact on other road users is kept to a minimum.

The A6011 & A52 will have a single lane closure in an eastbound direction between Regatta Way and Nottingham Road (RSPCA Junction) from 0400 – 1200; this closure is necessary to allow the cyclists to safely access the main section of the route.

There will be no access to Nottingham Road from the A52 in either direction between 0400 - 1200. During this period a diversion route will be signed via Cropwell Road. Egress from Nottingham Road onto the A52 will not be affected.

There will also be basic traffic management, as used in previous years, in place on the mini roundabout in the centre of Radcliffe between the hours of 0630 – 1200 and at the junction which leads onto The Green between the hours of 0845 – 1230.

For further details about the traffic management that will be implemented in your area as well as across the full route, please click on the QR code. This will take you to the information you will need to plan any journeys on the day. If you are passing or driving along the course, we advise you to allow additional time to complete your journey.

We are seeking your cooperation in supporting the event for a few hours on this day, as this is essential for the safety of both the cyclists and general road users.

We expect all of our athletes to behave in a courteous and considerate manner, but sadly on occasion a small minority let the side down. We would ask for your help in curbing any less than desirable behaviour. If you see an athlete littering or behaving in an antisocial manner while on the bike, please contact us on 07979 666452, with details of the incident, we will then disqualify the athlete concerned. This number will only be monitored on the day of the event.

Finally, we apologise for any inconvenience that the event may cause, but could I please encourage you to support the athletes, many of whom are competing for charities; this is a massive challenge, and they will undoubtedly be grateful of your support on the day.
